DEC. 11 (Th) E – 89	DATE FIXED TO SUBMIT ARGUMENTS – PUBLICATION Not later than this date a notice shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation setting forth the date fixed to submit arguments for and against any county or school measure. (E. C. § 9163, 9502 and Govt. Code § 6061)
	NOTE: A copy of the published notice shall be delivered to the district superintendent, and each notice shall be posted in the district office. (E. C. § 12113)
DEC. 12 (F) E – 88	ADOPT SPECIAL MEASURE ELECTION RESOLUTION Last day for governing boards to adopt a resolution calling a special school district election to place a measure on the ballot. Copies shall be filed with the county elections official. (Ed. C. § 5322)
DEC. 17 (W) E-83	AMENDMENT OR WITHDRAWAL OF MEASURE – DEADLINE Last day for county elections official to receive a resolution from a legislative body requesting to withdraw or amend a measure previously submitted for placement on the ballot. (E. C. § 9605) MEASURE LETTER DESIGNATION Last day for a district to request a specific letter designation in writing for a measure appearing on the ballot.

DEC. 19 (F) E – 81		ARGUMENTS – LAST DAY TO SUBMIT Last day to submit arguments for or against any county, district or school measure. Arguments may not exceed 300 words in length. (E. C. §§ 9501 and 9502)
		EXCEPTION : Provisions regarding word limitations do not apply to measures on school district reorganizations. (Ed. C.§ 35758)
		IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS – LAST DAY TO SUBMIT Recommended last day for County Counsel to transmit impartial analysis of any school measure. (E. C. § 9500)
DEC. 20* (Sa) E – 80*	DEC. 29* (M) E – 71*	PUBLIC EXAMINATION FOR BALLOT MEASURE MATERIALS During this period the elections official shall make available for public examination a copy of any ballot measure text, impartial analysis, argument, or bond statement if applicable, for any school measure. A fee may be charged to any person obtaining a copy of the materials. During this period any person may file a writ of mandate or an injunction to require any or all of the material to be amended or deleted. (E. C. § 9509)
DEC. 29 (M) E – 71		REBUTTALS – LAST DAY TO SUBMIT Last day for authors of arguments for or against a county, school or district measure to submit rebuttals. Rebuttals may not exceed 250 words in length. (E. C. § 9504)
DEC. 30** (Tu) E – 70**	(2015) JAN. 8 (Th) E – 61	PUBLIC EXAMINATION PERIOD FOR REBUTTALS During this period, rebuttals for measures shall be available for public examination. A fee may be charged to any person obtaining a copy of the material. During this period, any person may file a writ of mandate or an injunction to require any or all of the material to be amended or deleted.

FEB. 9 (M) E – 29	FEB. 28 (Sa) E – 10	OFFICIAL SAMPLE BALLOT AND VOTE BY MAIL INSTRUCTIONS BOOKLET MAILING Between these dates the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk shall mail the Official Sample Ballot and Vote By Mail Instructions Booklet to voters. (E. C. § 4101)
FEB. 23 (M) E – 15		CLOSE OF REGISTRATION Last day to transfer or register to vote in the election. (E. C. §§ 2102 (a) and 2107)
FEB. 24 (Tu) E – 14	MAR. 10 (Tu) 8:00 P.M. ELECTION DAY	NEW CITIZEN REGISTRATION/VOTING A new citizen is eligible to register and vote at the office of, or at another location designated by, the county elections official at any time beginning on the 14th day before an election and ending at the close of polls on the election day following the date on which that person became a citizen. (E. C. § 3500)
FEB. 28 (Sa) E – 10		CENTRAL TALLY LOCATION – PUBLICATION On or before this date a notice specifying the public place to be used as the Central tally location for counting the ballots shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation within the jurisdiction. (E. C. § 12109 and Govt. § 6061) PROCESSING OF VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS The processing of vote by mail ballots may commence on the 10 th day before the election but the results of the tally shall not be released until after the polls close. (E. C. § 15101(b))
MAR. 6 (F) E – 4		REQUEST FOR A REPLACEMENT BALLOT Last day the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk will send a replacement ballot in the mail. NOTE: Voters can pick up (and return) a replacement ballot in person up to election day at the Norwalk office of the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk.

MAR. 10 (Tu) 8:00 P.M.	ELECTION DAY - OFFICIAL VOTED BALLOTS RETURNED
ELECTION DAY	Last day for ballots to be received (by mail or in person) by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk. (E. C. § 4103)
	Any vote by mail ballot cast under this division shall be timely cast if it is received by the voter's elections official via the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company no later than three days after election day in addition to the provisions set forth in E. C. 3020, Sections 1 and 2. (E. C. § 3020(b) Section 1 and 2)
MAR. 12 (Th)	CANVASS OF ELECTION RETURNS
E + 2	The canvass of election returns shall commence no later than the first Thursday following the election. (E. C. § 15301)
MAR. 20 (F)	COMPLETION OF OFFICIAL CANVASS
E + 10	The Official Canvass of returns shall be completed within 28 days of the election.

	NOTE: On Friday, March 20, 2015 (E+10) the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk is tentatively scheduled to certify the election results. On Tuesday, March 31, 2015 the Board of Supervisors is tentatively scheduled to declare the election results official. (E. C. § 15400)
