## L.A. County Registrar of Voters to Begin Training Pollworkers for the Nov. 4, 2014 General Election

The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) will begin training volunteer pollworkers on Oct. 1 across the county in preparation for the upcoming Nov. 4, 2014 General Election.

The large-scale effort to prepare about 22,200 volunteers for Election Day includes 421 trainings at 88 locations throughout L.A. County over the course of the next four weeks. The RR/CC makes it easy and convenient for dedicated volunteers by providing trainings in locations near pollworkers.

Volunteers are still needed for the election throughout Los Angeles County, especially in Beverly Hills, El Segundo, Glendora, Los Angeles, Pasadena, Sherman Oaks, Studio City, Valencia and all beach cities.

To become a pollworker in Los Angeles County, you must be:

- 18 years of age or older
- A resident of California
- A United States citizen registered to vote or a legal permanent resident (green card holder)
