MAY 27 (Th) E-110		<b>NOTICE OF ELECTION – PUBLICATION</b> Recommended last day to publish a notice of election. A general press release providing information on the elective offices and the telephone number to call regarding candidate nomination procedures shall also be issued. (E. C. §§ 12101 and 12102)
JUNE 1 (Tu) E-105	JUNE 28 (M) E-78	<b>NOMINATION PERIOD</b> First and last day to circulate and leave nomination documents for examination and certification with the City Clerk. Candidate must also file a Declaration of Candidacy and Ballot Designation worksheet during this period. (E. C. §§ 8028, 8040, 8041, 8062 and 10704 and 13107.3) <b>NOTE: Fax not acceptable.</b>  <b>CANDIDATE STATEMENTS</b> During this period, candidates may file a candidate statement not to exceed the word limitation prescribed by the district governing body ( <b>200 or 400 words</b> ) for inclusion with the Official Sample Ballot. The statement shall be filed no later than the last day to file declarations of candidacy. (E. C. §§ 10540 and 13307)  <b>OFFICER’S CANDIDATE STATEMENT</b> During this period, the officer sought to be recalled may file, along with payment or estimate cost or printing statement, a candidate statement not to exceed 200 words for inclusion in the voting material. The statement and fee shall be submitted no later than the last day to file nomination documents. (E. C. §§. 13307 and 11327)

<b>JUNE 29 (Tu)</b> E-77	<b>JULY 8 (Th)</b> E-68	<p><b>PUBLIC EXAMINATION PERIOD FOR CANDIDATE STATEMENTS/CANDIDATE NAMES AND BALLOT DESIGNATIONS</b></p> <p>During this period, candidate statements, candidate names, and ballot designations shall be open for public examination. A fee may be charged to any person obtaining a copy of the material. Any person may challenge the aforementioned candidate information by filing a petition for writ of mandate. (E. C. § 13313 and 13314)</p>
<b>JULY 7 (W)</b> E-69		<p><b>RANDOMIZED ALPHABET DRAWING BY SECRETARY OF STATE</b></p> <p>Recommended date for Secretary of State to hold a public drawing to determine the order of candidate names on ballot by randomly drawing each letter of the alphabet. (E. C. § 13112(d))</p>
<b>JULY 12 (M)</b> E-64	<b>JULY 16 (F)</b> E-60	<p><b>BALLOT PROOFS</b></p> <p>Recommended period for the county elections official to deliver copies of official ballot proofs to City Clerk for approval.</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Corrections to any ballots material must be submitted to the county elections official within 24 hours of receipt.</p>
<b>JULY 14 (W)</b> E-62	<b>JULY 16 (F)</b> E-60	<p><b>TRANSLITERATION REVIEW PERIOD</b></p> <p>Recommended first and last day candidates may review transliteration of their names. Requests for changes must be submitted to the county elections official no later then the last day of the review period.</p>
<b>JULY 19 (M)</b> E-57	<b>AUG. 31 (Tu)</b> E-14 <b>5:00 P.M.</b>	<p><b>WRITE-IN CANDIDATE PERIOD</b></p> <p>A name written on a ballot will not be counted unless the person has filed a declaration of candidacy during this period stating that they are a write-in candidate for the election. (E. C. §§ 8600 and 8601)</p>
<b>JULY 31 (Sa)*</b> E-45		<p><b>MILITARY AND OVERSEAS BALLOTS</b></p> <p>Last day for the county elections official to transmit ballots and balloting materials to absent military or overseas voters who have requested them by this date. (E. C. § 3114)</p>

<b>AUG. 16 (M)</b> E-29	<b>MAILING OF VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS</b> No Later than 29 days before the day of the election, the county elections official shall begin mailing the materials required by Section 3010. (E.C. § 3001 (b), 3010 and 3206)
<b>AUG. 30 (M)</b> E-15	<b>CLOSE OF REGISTRATION</b> Last day to register or transfer to vote in the election. (E.C. § 2102 and 2107)
<b>SEP. 14 (Tu)</b> ELECTION DAY	<b>ELECTION DAY</b> Voting is from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. (E.C. § 1412)  <b>VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS RETURNED – 8:00 P.M.</b> Last day for Vote By Mail ballots to be received or turned in personally by the vote at any polling place in the jurisdiction. An authorized representative may return the voted ballot under specified conditions. (E.C. §§ 3017 and 3021)  Any vote by mail cast under this division shall be timely cast if it is received by the voter’s elections official via the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company no later than three days after election day in addition to the provisions set forth in E.C. § 3020, Section 1 and 2. (E.C. § 3020(b) Sections 1 and 2)
