VOTE CENTER SAFETY REFERENCE GUIDE

This guide contains key penal provisions found within the California Elections Code, Penal Provisions Division 18 § 18000-18700.

- Campaigning within 100 feet of a Vote Center or an outdoor voting site is a misdemeanor.
- Intimidating voters is a felony.
- Interfering with an election official and their process is a felony.
- Bribing in exchange for a ballot cast is a felony.

Campaigning within 100 feet of a vote center is a misdemeanor.

Electioneering at or Near Voting Locations Prohibited (CA Elections Code § 18370)

A person shall not on Election Day, or any time that a voter may be casting a ballot, within the 100 foot limit of a Vote Center, or an outdoor voting site, solicit a vote or speak to a voter on the subject of marking the voter's ballot, place a sign relating to voters' qualifications or speak to a voter on the subject of the voter's qualifications, or circulate an initiative, referendum, recall or nomination petition or any other petition. Any person who violates any of these prohibitions is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Interfering with an election official or the election process is a felony.

Vandalism at Vote Centers (CA Elections Code § 18380)

No person, during any election, shall remove or destroy any of the supplies or other conveniences placed in the voting booths, or remove, or deface printed voter instructions or any voter list or roster, or remove, tear down, or deface the signs identifying the location of a Vote Center or identifying areas within 100 feet of a Vote Center. Any person who violates any of these prohibitions is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Corruption of the Voting Process (CA Elections Code § 18502)

Any person who in any manner interferes with the officers holding an election or conducting a canvass, or with the voters lawfully exercising their rights of voting at an election, as to prevent the election or canvass from being fairly held and lawfully conducted, is punishable by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for 16 months or two or three years.

Tampering with Voting System (CA Elections Code § 18564)

A person shall not interfere with, or attempt to interfere with, the correct operation of any voting system (or component), or knowingly, and without authorization possess a key to a voting machine, or willfully substitute or attempts to substitute forged or counterfeit ballot tally software program source codes. Any person violating this prohibition is guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for two, three, or four years.

Falsely Acting as Elections Official (CA Elections Code § 18575)

A person shall not, at any election, without first having been appointed and qualified, act as an election officer and perform or discharge any of the duties of an election officer in regard to the handling, counting, or canvassing of any ballots. Any person violating this prohibition is guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for two, three or four years.

Intimidating voters is a felony.

Intimidation of Voters (CA Elections Code § 18540)

A person shall not threaten to make use of any force, violence, or tactic of coercion or intimidation, to induce or compel any other person to vote or refrain from voting at any election or in any particular way. Any person violating this prohibition is guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for 16 months or two or three years.

Unauthorized Uniformed Personnel (CA Elections Code § 18544)

Any person in possession of a firearm or any uniformed peace officer, private guard, or security personnel who is stationed in the immediate vicinity of a Vote Center without written authorization of the county elections official is prohibited. This section does not apply to a peace officer conducting official business or who is at the Vote Center to cast his or her vote. Any person violating this prohibition is guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for 16 months or two or three years.

Bribing in exchange for a ballot cast is a felony.

Payment for Voting (CA Elections Code § 18310)

A person shall not directly or through any other person pay or receive any money or other valuable consideration before, during, or after an election in order to reward any person or as a reward for voting. Any person violating this prohibition is guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for 16 months or two or three years.

Bribery (CA ELECTIONS CODE § 18523)

A person shall not directly or through any other person advance or pay, or cause to pay, any money or other valuable thing to or for the use of any other person, with the intent that it, or any part thereof, shall be used in bribery at any election. Any person violating this prohibition is guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for 16 months or two or three years.
