With your permission, your child's high school and the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk would like to encourage your child to volunteer as a student election worker for the upcoming November 8, 2022 General Election. Participating students earn a stipend up to \$380 along with hands on experience with the democratic process! Here are some key details regarding this exciting opportunity!

- All students who are placed will be given the following 3-day election worker assignment:
 - o Sat, Nov 5: 9am 8pm
 - o Sun, Nov 6: 9am 8pm
 - o Tue, Nov 8: 6am 9pm
- Students are required to complete in-person and online training prior to their 3-day assignment
- Students are assigned to a vote center within a 5 7 mile radius of their home or school
- Students are responsible for providing their own transportation to and from training as well as the vote center for their assignment.

Student Election Workers receive the following rewards for their participation:

- \$100 each day they serve at the vote center, plus an \$80 bonus for completing training
 - o The stipend is mailed 4 6 weeks after the election
- Hands-on introduction to the democratic process
- Students can earn community service/service learning credit
- Student election workers are more likely to become lifelong voters
- Student participation looks great on college/scholarship applications and resumes
- Students gain satisfaction from helping out their community

In order to be considered for this program, students must complete the attached Student Election Worker Consent Form and obtain parent and teacher signatures. Then they must complete the online Student Election Worker Application and attach the consent form before submitting. Positions are limited so please apply as soon as possible. If for some reason your child is unable to participate after they have been assigned to a vote center, please have your child call our office immediately. If your application is approved, log in to your election worker portal to register for an in-person training class. Please do so as soon as possible as training classes are limited.
Log in to your portal to complete the 3-hour online training class. This online class can be completed in multiple sessions if needed.
Attend your scheduled in-person training class.
Once you receive your vote center assignment, log in to your portal to verify your assignment details and click "Confirm."
