## The RR/CC Mailed Over 2.1 Million Vote by Mail Ballots

March 7, 2017 Consolidated Municipal and Special Elections

**LOS ANGELES** – The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) mailed **2,167,165** Vote by Mail (VBM) Ballots across Los Angeles County for the March 7<sup>th</sup> Election.

Requesting a Vote by Mail ballot can be done <u>online</u>, or by using the back of the Official Sample Ballot. Permanent VBM voters do not have to apply for again.

Check on the status of your VBM ballot by visiting lavote.net.

Drop off your VBM ballot before Election Day by visiting one of 69 drop-off locations in LA County. <u>Find</u> the nearest location.

The deadline to request a VBM ballot is **February 28**. Vote by Mail voters who choose to vote at their polling place on Election Day must bring their VBM ballot to surrender, or they will be asked to cast a Provisional Ballot.

Additionally, today is the first day voters can vote early by visiting our office in Norwalk on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. Our office is open from 8am-5pm.

For translated election materials in Armenian, Chinese, Farsi, Hindi, Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog, Thai or Vietnamese, call (800) 815-2666, option 3.

Beginning January 1, 2015 all Vote by mail ballots postmarked by Election Day will be counted if received within three (3) days by the by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (E.C. § 3020).
