L.A. County Registrar Mails More Than 26,000 Ballots for March 12 Elections

San Marino and South Pasadena Residents to Vote in All-Mail Election

Approximately 26,600 ballots for two March 12 all-mail parcel tax elections were sent out by the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) today.

To date, the RR/CC has mailed more than 10,000 ballots for the San Marino Unified School District Parcel Tax Election. In addition, about 16,600 ballots were mailed for the South Pasadena Unified School District Parcel Tax Election.

The last day to register to vote in the March 12 elections is Monday, Feb. 25. Registering to vote is easy and can be done <u>online</u>, in person at any RR/CC branch or by mail. To get a form, citizens can <u>print one out</u>, pick one up at any government buildings or call 1(800) 481-VOTE. Citizens can also apply in person at the RR/CC's main office: 12400 Imperial Hwy., Norwalk, CA 90650.
