Vote by Mail Request Period Ending for the Dec. 3, 2013 Assembly District 54 Special Primary Election The deadline to request a Vote by Mail ballot is Nov. 26

The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean C. Logan reminds voters to request a Vote by Mail ballot by Tuesday, Nov. 26 for the Assembly District 54 Special Primary Election, which takes place on Dec. 3.

To date, the RR/CC has received 7,467 returned Vote by Mail ballots. More than 79,424 Vote by Mail ballots were mailed, accounting for more than 8 percent of the eligible registered voters in Assembly District 54. There are more than 274,000 eligible registered voters.

Requesting a Vote by Mail ballot is easy and can be done <u>online</u> or by using the back of the Official Sample Ballot. Registered voters can also apply in person at the RR/CC's main office: 12400 Imperial Hwy., 3rd floor, Room 3002, Norwalk, CA 90650.

L.A. County residents who applied for a Vote by Mail ballot can check the status of their ballot <u>online</u>.

Vote by Mail ballots must be received by the L.A. County RR/CC in Norwalk by 8 p.m. on Election Day. Voters can drop off or mail their ballot to RR/CC headquarters in Norwalk or drop their ballot off at any polling place in L.A. County on Election Day between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. Postmarked envelopes are not accepted.

Assembly District 54 includes portions or all of Baldwin Hills, Century City, Crenshaw, Culver City, Inglewood, Jefferson Park, Ladera Heights, Leimert Park, Los Angeles, Mar Vista, Mid City, View Park-Windsor Hills, West Los Angeles and Westwood.
